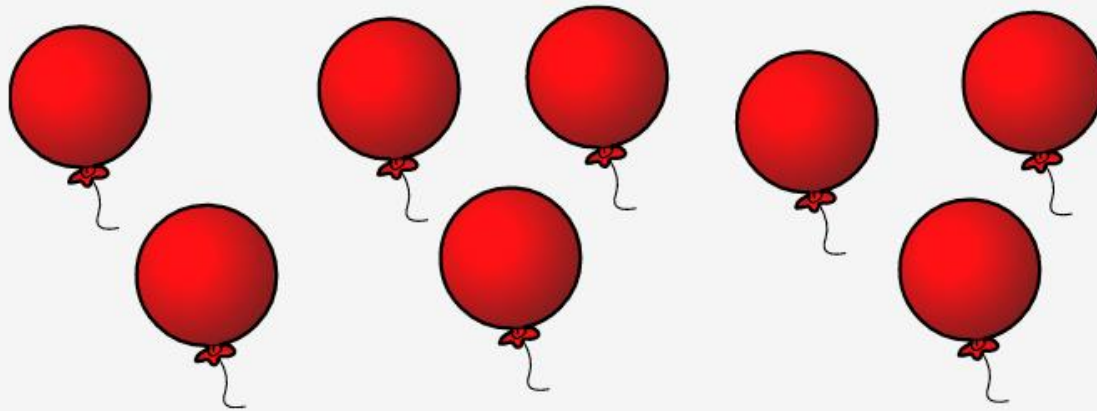

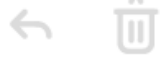
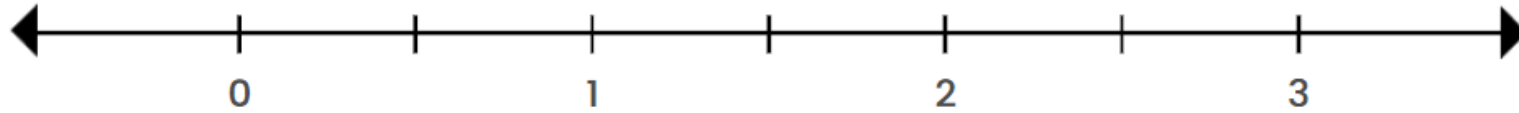

Number Line Item



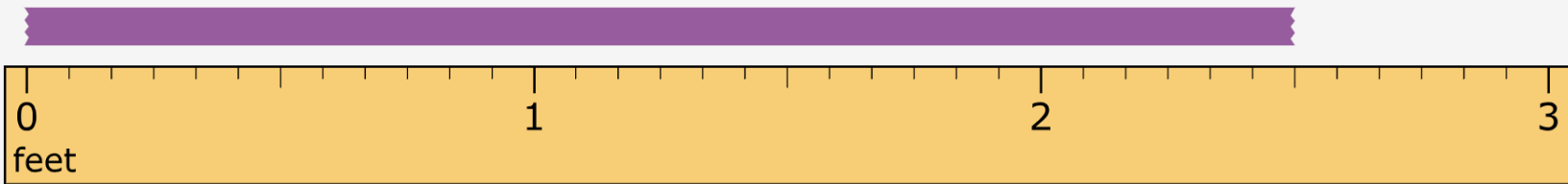
Click on the number line to show $\frac{1}{2}$.

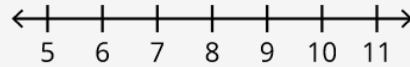


